

RTI Professional Learning Webinar Series Fall 2009: Using Research to Select & Design Effective Interventions

WHAT?

- A series of 9 webinars that provide professional learning on the topic of Response to Intervention (RTI). This series will provide schools and districts with information, concepts, and tools to support practitioners in finding, understanding, and applying research to their selection, purchase and design of effective interventions. The series brings together nationally-recognized RTI researchers and experts on RTI implementation, tools and resources from the Regional Educational Laboratory network and the US Department of Education Institute of Education Sciences (IES), and Georgia educators. It addresses the principles of Scientifically Based Research, Evidence-Based Decision-Making, and the latest research on effective RTI practices. The series also addresses key components of the GA RTI Guidance manual.
- The series is co-hosted by GaDOE and the Regional Educational Laboratory-Southeast (REL-SE) at the SERVE Center at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, with support from IES. The series builds upon and extends trainings on "Using Research to Strengthen Decision-Making in RTI" that GaDOE and REL-SE have been delivering around the state since fall, 2008.
- The format is 9 webinars. The webinars will be recorded and posted on a GaDOE website for access at any time after the series.

WHO?

- All school practitioners, administrators, and district staff in the state of Georgia who have responsibilities for and/or interest in RTI are invited to attend.
- Personnel at schools and districts are encouraged to participate in the series as teams; individuals may attend as well.

WHY?

- To strengthen understanding and encourage dialogue around the state of Georgia on how to find, understand, and use high-quality research in the selection and design of effective interventions. This series will also support practitioners as they seek the wise, research-based expenditure of ARRA stimulus funds.

WHEN?

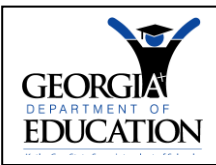
